

This text is from Mercator of the Cambridge Latin Course.

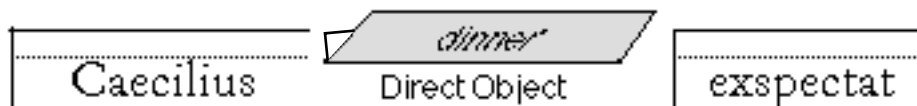
How to use:
